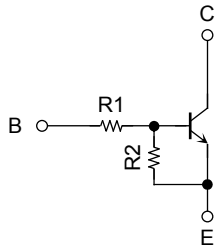

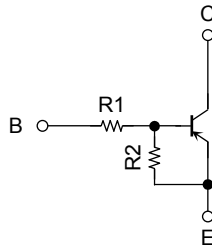
- Two devices are incorporated into a fine pitch small mold (6-pin) package.

**Q2**

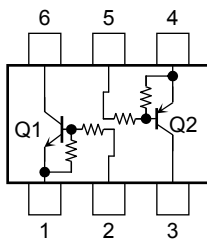


R1: 10 kΩ

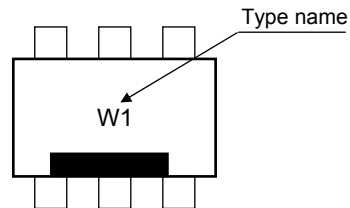

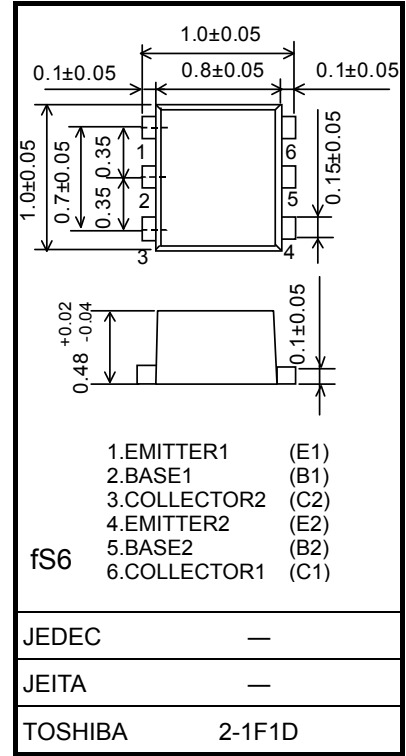
## Equivalent Circuit (top view)
