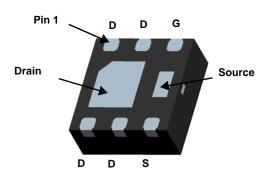

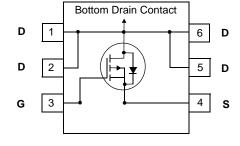


General Description

This device is designed specifically for battery charge or load switching in cellular handset and other ultraportable applications. It features a MOSFET with low on-state resistance.

The MicroFET 2X2 package offers exceptional thermal performance for its physical size and is well suited to linear mode applications.

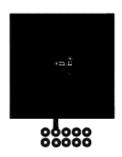

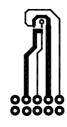

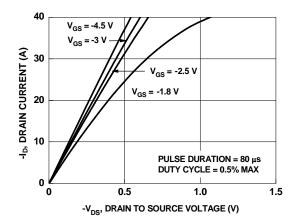


Figure 1. On-Region Characteristics

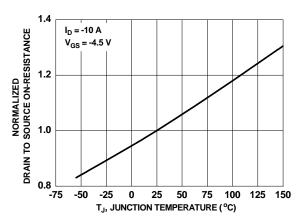


Figure 3. Normalized On-Resistance vs Junction Temperature

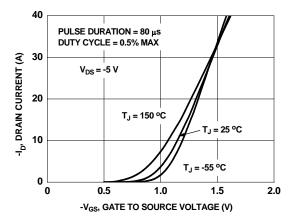


Figure 5. Transfer Characteristics

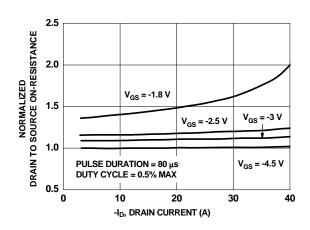


Figure 2. Normalized On-Resistance vs Drain Current and Gate Voltage

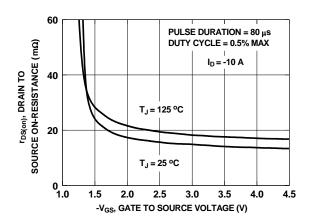


Figure 4. On-Resistance vs Gate to Source Voltage

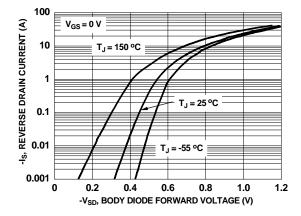


Figure 6. Source to Drain Diode Forward Voltage vs Source Current

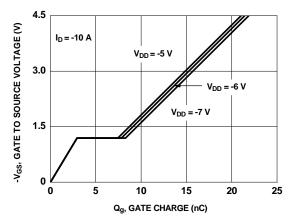


Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics

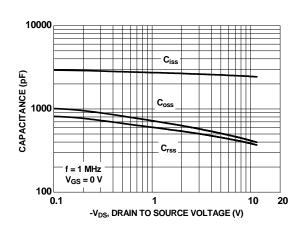


Figure 8. Capacitance vs Drain to Source Voltage

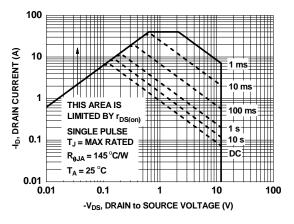


Figure 9. Forward Bias Safe Operating Area

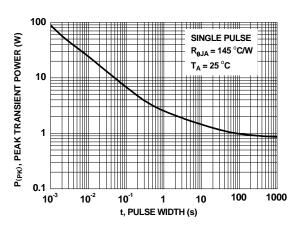


Figure 10. Single Pluse Maximum Power Dissipation

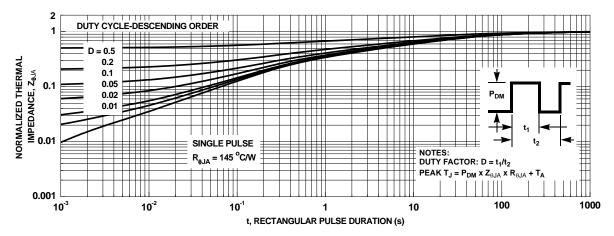
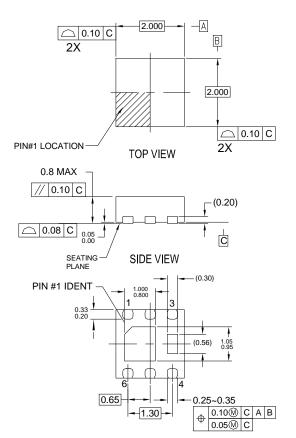
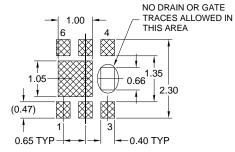


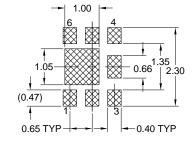
Figure 11. Junction-to-Ambient Transient Thermal Response Curve
