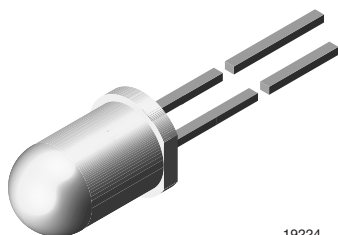

DESCRIPTION

The TLH.620. series was developed for standard applications like general indicating and lighting purposes.

It is housed in a 5 mm tinted non-diffused plastic package. The small viewing angle of these devices provides a high brightness.

Several selection types with different luminous intensities are offered. All LEDs are categorized in luminous intensity groups. The green and yellow LEDs are categorized additionally in wavelength groups.

That allows users to assemble LEDs with uniform appearance.

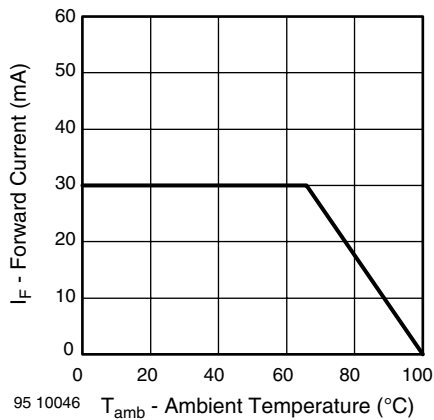


Figure 1. Forward Current vs. Ambient Temperature

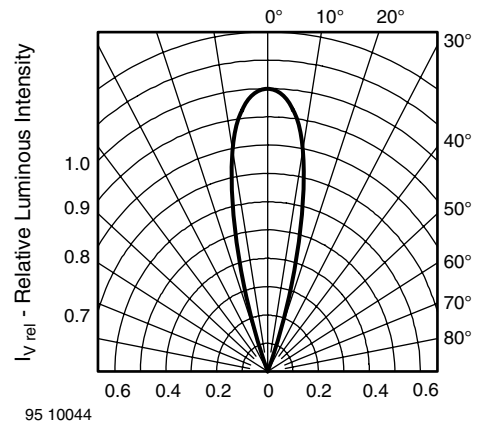


Figure 3. Rel. Luminous Intensity vs. Angular Displacement

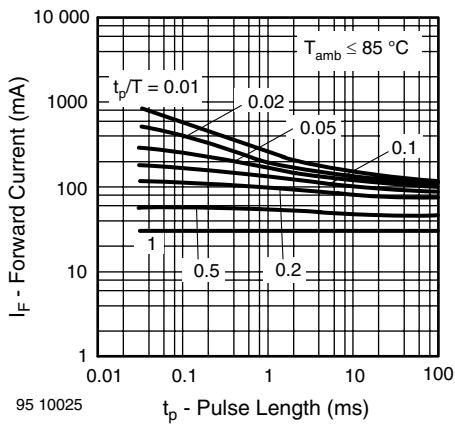


Figure 2. Forward Current vs. Pulse Length

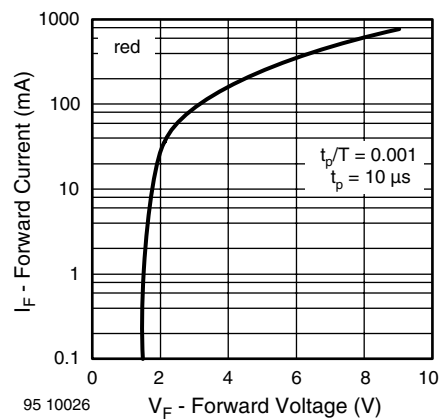


Figure 4. Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage

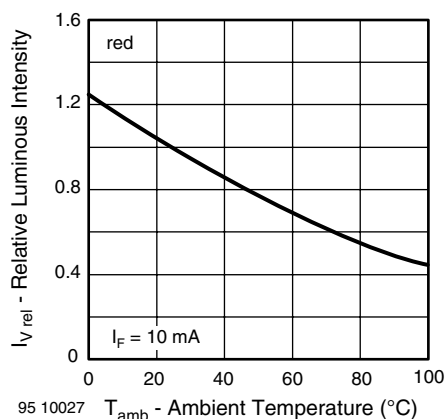


Figure 5. Rel. Luminous Intensity vs. Ambient Temperature

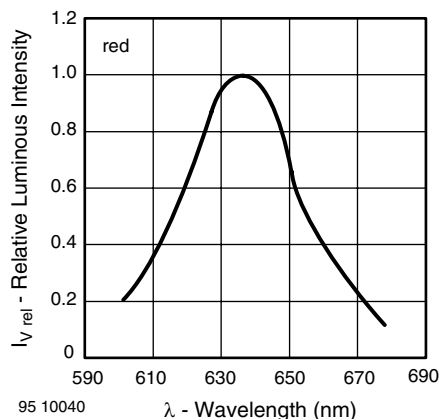


Figure 8. Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength

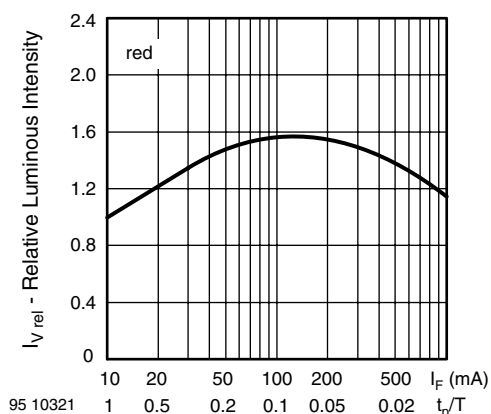


Figure 6. Rel. Lumin. Intensity vs. Forw. Current/Duty Cycle

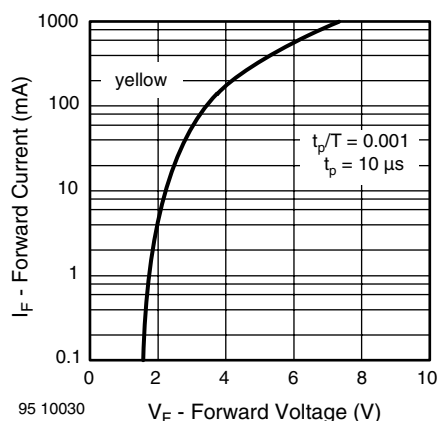


Figure 9. Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage

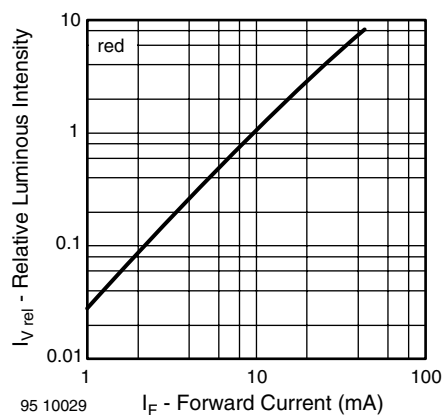


Figure 7. Relative Luminous Intensity vs. Forward Current

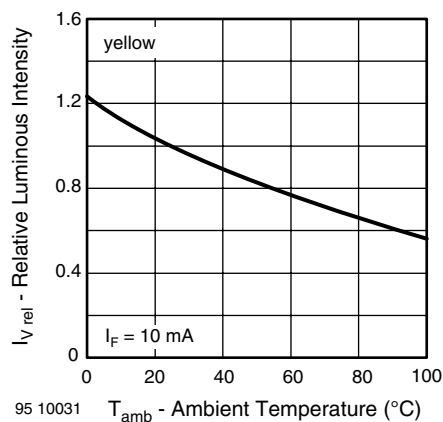


Figure 10. Rel. Luminous Intensity vs. Ambient Temperature

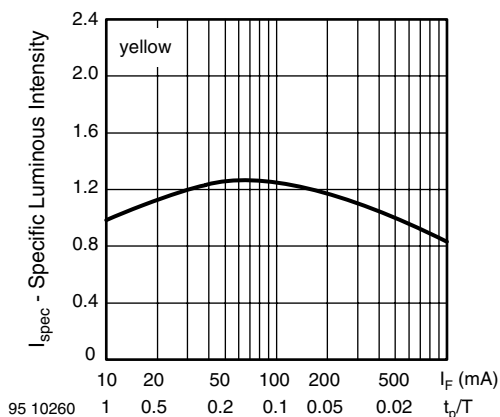


Figure 11. Rel. Lumin. Intensity vs. Forw. Current/Duty Cycle

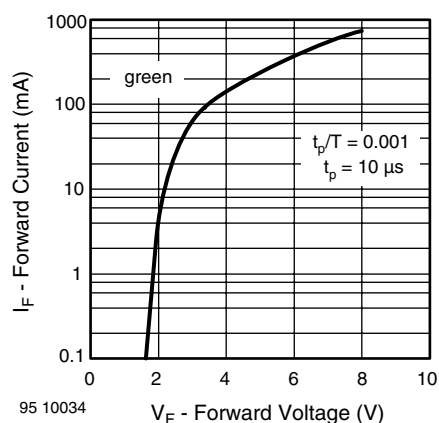


Figure 14. Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage

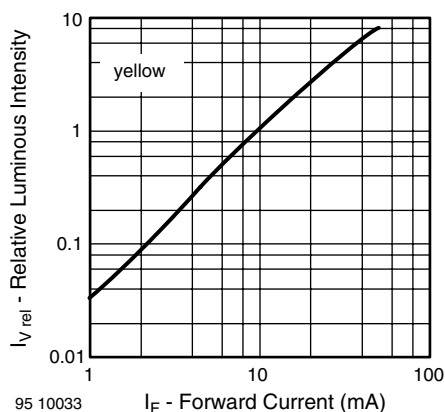


Figure 12. Relative Luminous Intensity vs. Forward Current

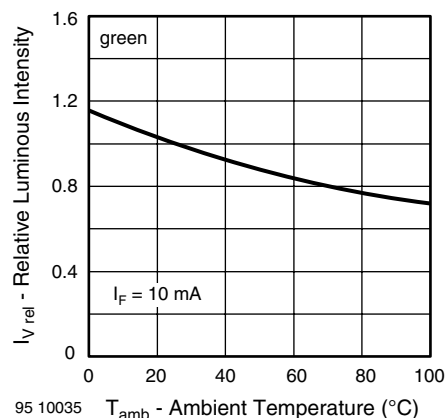


Figure 15. Rel. Luminous Intensity vs. Ambient Temperature

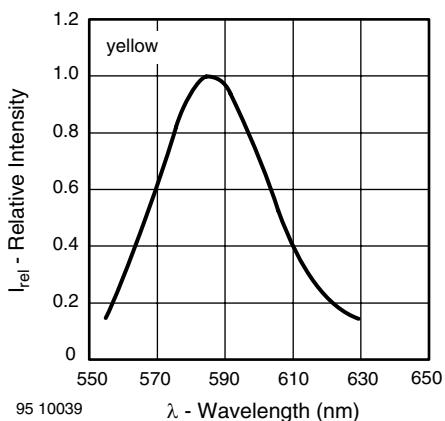


Figure 13. Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength

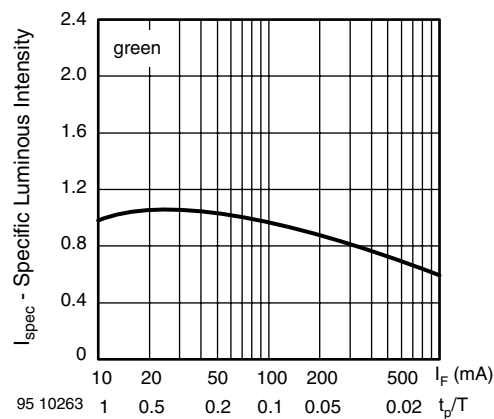


Figure 16. Specific Luminous Intensity vs. Forward Current

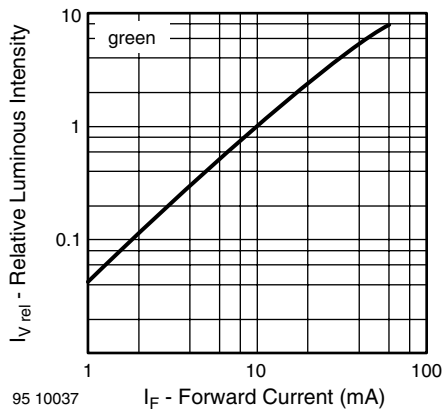


Figure 17. Relative Luminous Intensity vs. Forward Current

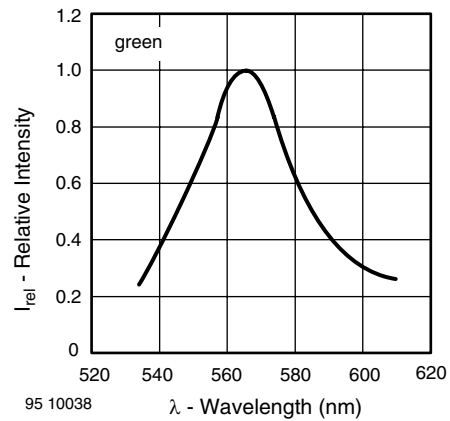
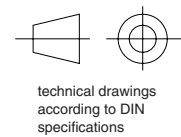
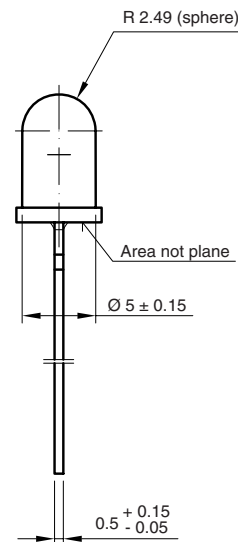
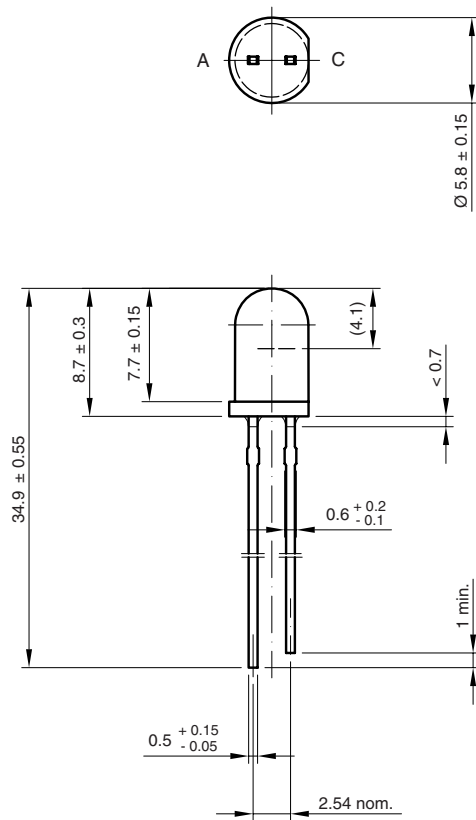


Figure 18. Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength

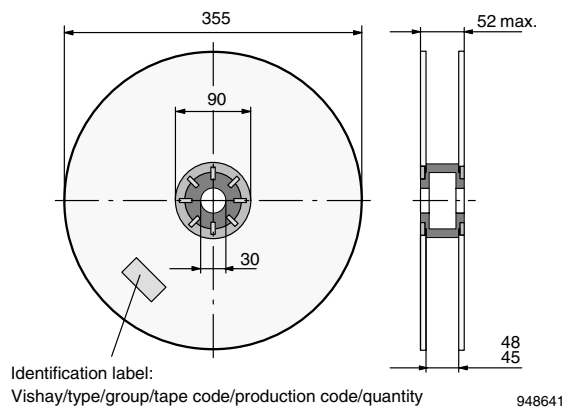


Figure 19. Reel Dimensions

AMMOPACK

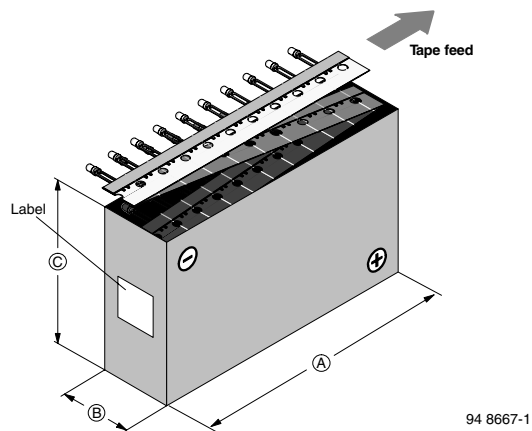


Figure 21. Tape Direction

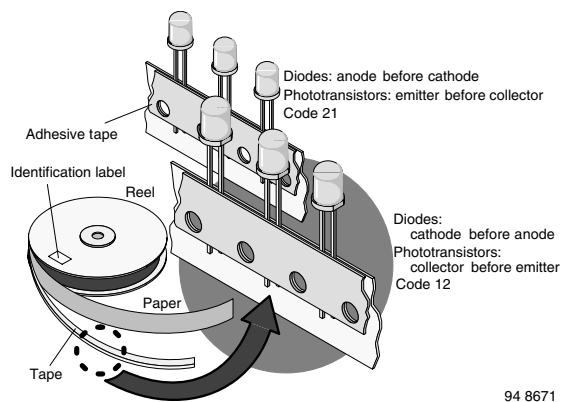
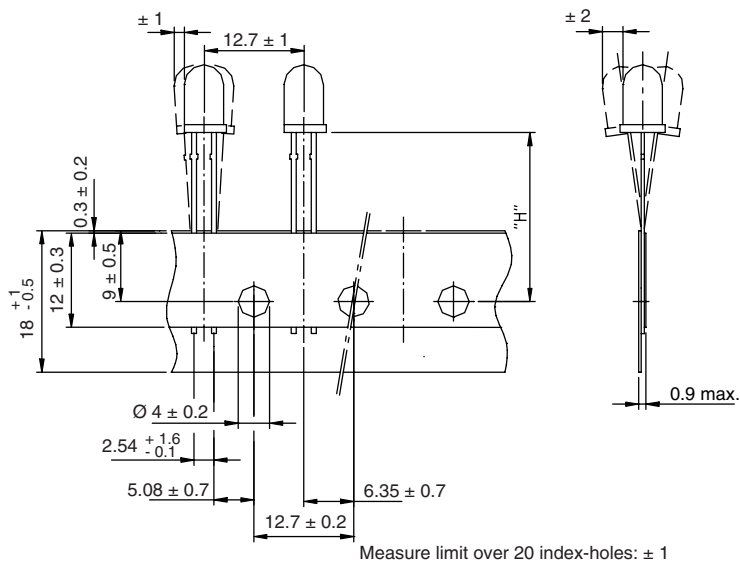


Figure 20. LED in Tape
